Polling was conducted online from July 19-22, 2021. Using its Bias Correct Engine to attain a representative sample, Change Research polled 1,160 registered voters in Florida, with an oversample N=319 in Broward County. Post-stratification was performed on age, gender, race/ethnicity, region, and 2020 presidential vote.



D5. What is the highest level of education you have completed?

- 14% High school diploma or less
- 29% Some college, but no degree
- 16% Associate's degree, or two-year college degree
- 23% Bachelor's degree, or four-year college degree
- 18% Graduate degree

D6. Generally speaking, do you think of yourself as a:

- 27% Strong Democrat
- 6% Not so strong Democrat
- 7% Independent - lean Democrat
- 10% Independent
- 8% Independent - lean Republican
- 6% Not so strong Republican
- 35% Strong Republican

Q1. How did you vote in the 2020 election for President, or for some reason were you unable to vote?

- 45% Joe Biden, the Democrat
- 49% Donald Trump, the Republican
- 3% Jo Jorgensen, the Libertarian
- 3% Did not vote
- 0% Not registered/Too young/Ineligible

Q2. How closely are you following stories about the protests in Cuba of the Cuban government?

- 28% Very closely
- 43% Somewhat closely
- 20% Not too closely
- 8% Not closely at all

Q3. What do you think should be the priority of the US government when it comes to Cuba?

- 34% Continuing the embargo of sale of food, medicine, and other goods to keep pressure on the Cuban government
- 44% Lifting the embargo to provide Covid-19 vaccines and alleviate hunger and other suffering Cubans are currently facing
- 23% Not sure

Q4. What do you think should be the priority of Joe Biden's foreign policy?

- 40% Supporting protesters with the ultimate goal of overthrowing Cuban government
- 42% Focusing on getting aid to Cubans during this crisis regardless of what happens to the Cuban government
- 18% Not sure
